

### **KEYNOTE SPEAKER**

### The Honorable Sue Gordon

Former Principal Deputy Director of National Intelligence



One of the most accomplished, innovative leaders in national security history, Sue Gordon was the country's number-two ranking intelligence official during her tenure as the fifth Principal Deputy Director of National Intelligence. Ms. Gordon oversaw the entire Intelligence Community of more than a dozen agencies, focusing on integrating intelligence across the organization, expanding outreach and partnerships, driving innovation and advancing diversity and inclusion.

Her three decades of transformative service include serving as the Deputy Director of the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (2015 to 2017) and 27 years at the Central Intelligence Agency, where she was involved in monumental operations including the raid of Osama Bin Laden. Notably, in 1998, she spearheaded the

formation of In-Q-TeI, a nonprofit accelerating the development and delivery of cutting-edge technologies to national security agencies.

Ms. Gordon's innovative leadership, integrity and advocacy for diversity, equity and inclusion are recognized through numerous awards, among them the Distinguished Intelligence and Distinguished Career Intelligence medals, Presidential Rank awards, and the Oliver Baker and William Webster awards. A fellow at Duke and Harvard Universities, she serves as an independent director for CACI International, Avantus Federal, BlackSky and the Mitre Corporation, as well as senior advisor for Pallas Advisors, the Draper Richards Kaplan Foundation, Primer.ai, Rebellion Defense and ColdQuanta. Ms. Gordon holds a B.S. in zoology (biomechanics) from Duke University where she was a three-time captain of the Duke Women's Basketball team.

### **EMCEE Jonathan Capehart**



Jonathan Capehart is Associate Editor of *The Washington Post* and an opinion writer and host of the weekly Post podcast "Capehart" and weekly Post Live show "First Look." Mr. Capehart's 1999 editorial campaign to save the famed Apollo Theater earned him and the *New York Daily News* board the Pulitzer Prize for Editorial Writing. From 2002 to 2004, he was deputy editorial page editor of the *New York Daily News*. He has also served as national affairs columnist at *Bloomberg News* and as policy adviser to Michael Bloomberg in his New York City mayoral campaign. He is the anchor of MSNBC's "The Saturday Show with Jonathan Capehart" and "The Sunday Show with Jonathan Capehart." In 2021, his MSNBC special "A Promised Land: A Conversation with Barack Obama" was nominated for an Emmy for "Outstanding News Discussion &

Analysis." His MSNBC special "Pride of the White House" won a 2022 GLAADMedia Award for "Outstanding TV Journalism – Long Form." A political analyst on "The PBS Newshour" and featured on PBS's "Brooks and Capehart," he was a Spring 2019 Fellow at the Georgetown Institute of Politics and Public Service. He graduated from Carleton College and holds honorary degrees from Carleton and LeMoyne College. In 2025, Twelve Books will publish his memoir.

### **Fernando Matus**

### Regional Security Officer, OSAC Bogotá-Colombia

Under Fernando Matus' leadership, OSAC Bogotá-Colombia members have thrived with high attendance at events and continual connection for ongoing threat awareness and sharing of best practices. Fernando is the driving force behind the Country Chapter's high engagement and a key factor in OSAC Bogotá-Colombia Chapter's recognition of the 2022 OSAC Country Chapter Achievement Award. His selfless commitment to the mission and affable, supportive nature inspire a community-centered collaborative spirit. Members consistently disseminate information for the broadest perspective on security issues across the country and region on organized crime, election security, civil unrest, human trafficking and cybersecurity and the future of Al. Fernando's strong bonds with local law enforcement, interagency partners and key, private-sector players, coupled with his attention to emerging threats and counter measures, maximize the Chapter's scope of awareness and ability to respond. A true team player, he consistently recognizes and celebrates the hard work of OSAC Analysts, Program Managers and members, serving as a sounding board throughout challenges of all kinds.

### DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, OSAC PROGRAM OFFICE

### **Phil Walker**

### **OSAC Major Events Lead**

For over a decade, Phil Walker has consistently demonstrated excellence in everything he does at OSAC. His steady, deliberate planning and keen awareness of where to access the most reliable information around any major event is remarkable. Phil has the innate ability to fuse capable teams of OSAC Analysts, Program Managers, Regional Security Officers (RSO) and wider diplomatic security personnel together with private-sector stakeholders. He's incredibly responsive and attentive to the needs of security managers and creates genuine one-on-one connections essential to threat mitigation and management. His calm head and prowess at keeping relevant information and OSAC resources flowing are critical at events. During the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup, Phil managed information sharing around ten different stadiums across four different time zones amid earthquakes, shootings and overzealous fan incidents. His expertise and skills also were key during the United Nations Climate Change Conferences and the Olympic Games, possibly the world's highest visibility athletic event and, thus, a hotbed of geopolitical confrontation, protests and potential sabotage and other attacks.

### DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, PRIVATE SECTOR

### **Dominik Vanicek**

### Private Sector Co-Chair, OSAC Germany

Dominik Vanicek consistently goes the extra mile in supporting OSAC Germany operations and outreach activities, first alongside RSO Paul Houston and now with RSO Peter Denoia. He led the merger of multiple Chapters into one unified OSAC Germany to amplify the network and keep members informed during crises and downtimes alike. Following the invasion of Ukraine, Dominik organized regular member briefings and has continued regular updates. Technology is a critical focus for him. He recruits experts to speak at member meetings on robotics, Al and cybersecurity. He deftly uses technology to expand communications channels to deepen member engagement and to celebrate members' important contributions. He organized and spoke at a Young Professionals Conference in Frankfurt to spark interest in a new generation of OSAC members. Thoughtful and strategic, Dominik fosters a Chapter culture of inclusivity and collaboration, ensuring that members' diverse needs are addressed and that their input is always valued.

### COMMON INTEREST COMMITTEE ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

### **Faith-Based Sector Committee**

Often working in the most austere and challenging environments with very limited resources, the Faith-Based Sector Committee (FBSC) members provide a kind of support that is uniquely necessary and impactful. The FBSC's strength derives from its common cause of helping those from countless unique missions to stay connected, informed and secure as one. Co-chairs Evan Poss and Jeremy Yamin, together with wider FBSC membership, have truly stepped up throughout recent crises. The FBSC has demonstrated a commendable ability to anticipate and address top-line threats and to work together to defend against them. In 2023, FBSC shared up-to-the-minute information during the Sudan evacuations, provided critical insights on the political instability in Chad, fused ongoing humanitarian assistance in Haiti, shared on-the-ground insights during the escalated conflict in Israel and Palestine and more. At its Salt Lake City conference this spring, the FBSC focused on "improved decision making" based on actual experience such as hostage release, training and preparation for travelers to high-threat areas, identifying emerging threats to religious freedoms and confronting ethical dilemmas during a crisis.

### **COUNTRY CHAPTER ACHIEVEMENT AWARD**

### **OSAC Johannesburg-South Africa**

The OSAC Johannesburg-South Africa Chapter has truly elevated the discourse of global security for U.S. organizations operating in South Africa. The Chapter fosters an undeniable culture of trust within their membership and builds strong bonds that keep all OSAC members better informed and able to do their jobs. Security professionals in the region know where to turn to for accurate, timely information and engaged, proactive Chapter membership activities. Public Sector Chair RSO Denis O'Sullivan and Private Sector Co-Chair Andrew Kelly nurture a steady two-way information flow to surmount industry competition barriers and seal the public-private knowledge gap. They launched diversity initiatives, empowering female leads into newly established special interest groups, and successfully encouraged participation across a broad range of industries. They also fielded many calls for support during turbulent times. Chapter leadership raised awareness around risks during the 2022 Pride march in Sandton, delivered innovative ideas to South Africa's electricity crisis and provided instructive workshops on crisis management in partnership with the U.S. Consulate to help build readiness for future threats.

### Thank you, Rich!

At the end of 2023, Rich Davis steps down as ISF President, a position he has held for the last six years. His ISF leadership has been nothing short of astounding. His tenacious fundraising prowess helped ISF go from its humble first annual dinner to one of the most prestigious events in the global security community, raising over \$1 million annually and attracting hundreds of guests. He has shepherded ISF strategic plans to launch an ISF grants program to support smaller, U.S. nonprofits in the security space and to diversify the ISF Board of Directors.

During his ISF tenure, OSAC programs have expanded and, in February 2023, he led the boards of ISF and the now-dissolved nonprofit, the Domestic Security Partnership, through a successful merger. While he is stepping down from the ISF as president, he will remain an ISF Board member to continue his decades-long vision for and unwavering focus on thriving public-private partnerships.

Rich is a legend in the security industry. His years at United included 22 as Managing Director, Global Security and oversight for United's response to the 9/11 attacks. How he leads is perhaps his greatest legacy. With humor and humility, kindness and authenticity, Rich creates an environment that welcomes everyone's voice and values different perspectives. He is a sought-after mentor, a trusted colleague and treasured friend. Long a practitioner of today's collaborative leadership model, Rich spent his career creating connections between the private and public sectors. The partnership model he championed at United with federal, state and local governments and in concert with airport authorities and other airlines is now the standard throughout the security profession.

A true servant leader, Rich shares his expertise across the security community. He was the longest-running OSAC Council member (2006 to 2018). Rich was a member of the Domestic Security Alliance Council (DSAC) from 2007 until 2018, eight years on the DSAC Executive Working Group. A member of the International Security Management Association (ISMA) since 2007, he served for five years on the ISMA Board of Directors. He has chaired the International Air Transport Association Security Committee and the Air Transport Association Security Committee multiple times.

Retired from United since 2018, Rich is Senior Security Advisor to International SOS. He earned a B.A. in History from DePaul University and is a very proud son of Chicago, where he and his wife, Dar, raised three children and reside today.
