# Year in Review

## TSF IMPACT

In 2023, The Security Foundation’s support of public-private partnerships encompassed domestic and global security for the first time in its history. We continued our ongoing, founding support of OSAC, while adding funding for DSAC events and programs through the merger with the former Domestic Security Partnership (DSP).

Our merger with DSP was met with overwhelming support. For donors, a singular nonprofit organization addressing domestic and global funding needs allows more choice in program support and more efficiency with giving. Administration of TSF-funded grants for programs is more streamlined for government partners and TSF staff. The Board of DSP and TSF merged, creating a cohesive group of the industry’s most trusted leaders.

# TSF Leadership

This past year was significant for TSF Board leadership. The Board continued its strategic planning process and its important work in diversity, equity and inclusion efforts for the security industry. In April 2023, TSF hosted the first-ever Joint DEI Summit for leading security organizations: ASIS, DSAC, ISMA, OSAC and TSF.

On December 31, 2023, Rich Davis, TSF President for the past six years, completed his two terms, transitioning to his valued role as an active TSF Board member with unparalleled perspective on our organization. We celebrated Rich's leadership of TSF and the broader security community at the 12th Annual TSF Dinner with heartfelt remarks and a surprise tribute video showcasing the impact of his leadership and legendary commitment to creating deeper connections and a palpable sense of community across our profession. As TSF President, he led on several important accomplishments: the creation of a TSF endowment and TSF's Nonprofit Grants Program; diversification of TSF's Board of Directors; the merger with the Domestic Security Partnership; and the expansion of TSF staff.

On December 31, we also bid a fond farewell to longtime Board members Jerry Brennan and Dan Schler, who completed their terms of service. Both leaders have contributed greatly to the growth of TSF through their talents, time and trusted, steady guidance.

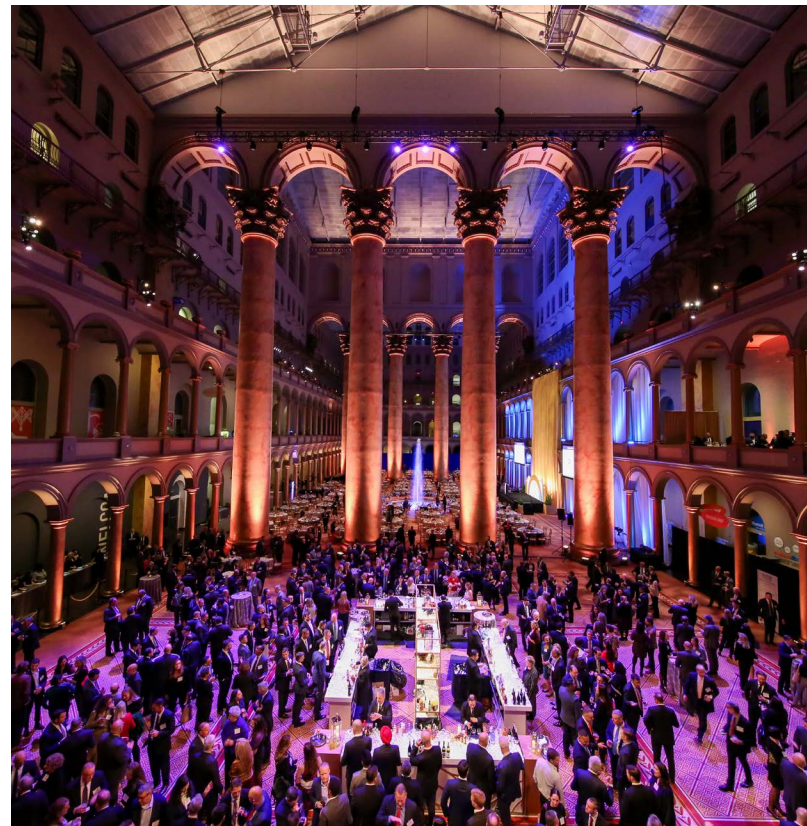

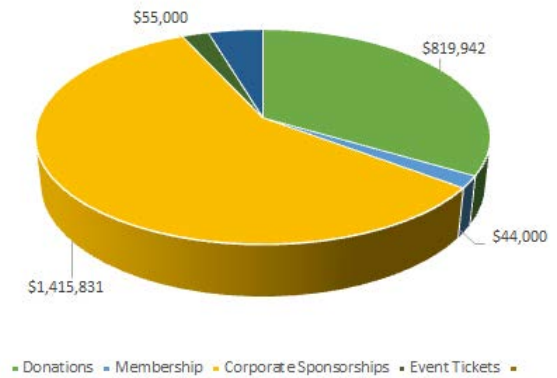

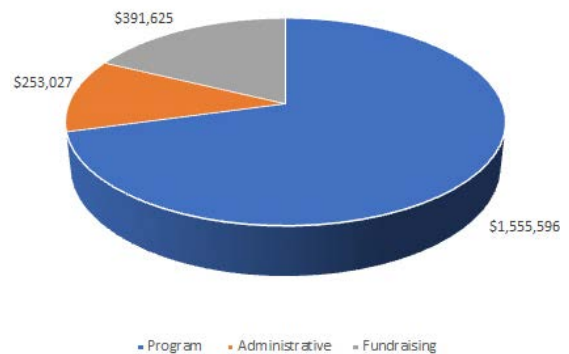
Total Revenue-\$2,447,843
